




Online payment options include Visa, Mastercard and PayPal. Alternatively, you can choose to pay over 10 weeks using LatitudePay.

STEP 1

Go to www.advancedlife.com.au on your computer, phone or tablet.

STEP 2

Enter your school code:

L6Y 7C2 DMX

in the 'order and download' box. This will take you to your school's secure online ordering site.



STEP 3

Click on 'Order Photos' and complete your details and procedures. During this process you can place orders for additional children at your school and sibling photos, if available







cash/envelope ordering Your school prefers orders to be placed online.

However, if you are unable to order online, please complete your order using the order envelope provided.

STEP 1

Complete a separate order envelope for each individual child's package/s ordered. If ordering for more than one child, payment should be enclosed in the envelope of the eldest child and this should be indicated on the envelope of the other child/children (the envelope that does not have cash enclosed).

STEP 2

Enclose exact cash payment in one envelope for the package/s you are ordering. Payment for more than one child should be in the eldest child's envelope and marked at the bottom of the envelope in the space provided.

STEP 3

Return your completed envelope/s, with correct cash payment, to our photographers on the day.

Please note: You must enclose exact correct payment, as change is not available. Credit card payments can only be made online and we no longer accept cheques. There is a separate envelope for sibling photo orders, should your school choose to offer sibling photos.

School photographs will be returned to your school 4-6 weeks after the day of photography

IMPORTANT - "not for publication" students

If you have instructed your school that your child's image is "not for publication" (sometimes called "do not publish" or "not for media release" instructions), the school will ensure that your child is not presented to our photographers on photo day and school photographs will not be available for purchase. If you wish to change your instruction, then you must notify your school, so they change their records and identify your child as able to be photographed for school photography purposes. All students presented to our photographers by your school on photo day will be photographed, their images will appear in school photography packages with their fellow students and these packages will be available to purchase by all families.



Good for kids good for life Alternatives to Sandwiches

If your child doesn't like sandwiches or wants more variety in their lunchbox try these ideas:

- Try everyday meals like salads, soup, pasta or fried rice. Save leftovers from dinner to save time.
- Prepare freezer friendly lunch box items like zuchinni slice or mini frittattas – ready to grab and go in the morning.
- Pack sandwich ingredients seperately for your child to put together just before eating.



Fried Rice Salad

- Heat oil in a large fry pan or wok over high heat.
- Sauté diced onion, capsicum, carrot and ham.
- Add cooked rice, corn kernels, green onions & soy sauce. Stir fry for 2-3 minutes, mixing well
- Transfer to a bowl to cool.
- Spoon salad into containers and top with cherry tomatoes and coriander.
- Store in the fridge ready to be added to the lunchbox.

Defence School Mentor Program: Position Description

About our school:

Grahamstown Public School is in the Port Stephens area and draws many students from families with a low socioeconomic background. There are currently 315 students from an increasingly diverse cultural heritage, including 61 Aboriginal students and 17 Defence Force family students. Grahamstown Public School currently operates 12 mainstream classes and has 10 students enrolled in MC and AU classes. We have a staff of over 45, including teaching, support and administrative staff, who are dedicated to achieving our vision. With a FOEI of 141, we need a strong focus on supporting students and their personal and academic development. Student well-being is endorsed through an active Learning Support Team, student leadership development, a staff dedicated to furthering wellbeing and strong communication between home and school. Our school works in partnership with community agencies such as The Smith Family, KU Steps To Starting School, Port Stephens Family Services and Wandiyali to provide ongoing wellbeing support to families and young children. Our school is situated on Worimi land, and we have a strong partnership with the Yooyong Aboriginal Education Consultative Group who support us in developing our Aboriginal students, embedding Aboriginal perspectives into our practices and building knowledge of and respect for our Aboriginal heritage and culture. Our School proudly offers a wide range of extra curricula activities to develop interest, skill and talent through sport, visual and performing arts and environmental projects. Grahamstown Public School works in collaboration with the entire community to support students to: grow with pride, learn for life and strive to be the best that they can be.

Role Overview:

Grahamstown Public School is seeking to appoint a Defence School Mentor (DSM) who is passionate about the wellbeing of children and young adults as part of the Defence School Mentor Program (DSMP). This program, delivered in schools, is designed to provide practical assistance to Defence families and support the social and emotional wellbeing of Defence students within their schools. The role is funded by the Defence Member and Family Support (DMFS) Branch, of the Commonwealth Department of Defence. The DSM role provides specialised, on-site support to meet the needs of Defence students and their families within the school community. The DSM's role is embedded in Grahamstown Public School's Wellbeing team. Please see the below table for a description of the position.
